August 29th 2011 is 100 years to the day that Hilda Hewlett became the first British woman to receive her pilot's licence. The challenge is to get as many women of all ages airborne on August 29th as possible to celebrate this centenary, be they qualified pilots, student pilots or passengers.

How to enter:

Visiting pilots are requested to enter either their point of departure or their destination. Home-based pilots not planning to land away are requested to put Local.
